BY-LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

The Municipality of Red Lake is currently accepting applications for the position of By-Law Enforcement Officer. This is a one-year term position starting April 1, 2006.

Reporting to the Clerk, the By-Law Enforcement Officer will assume responsibility for the administration, planning, and management of the By-Law Department.

DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE

No person shall allow or permit any dog to run at large within the limits of the Municipality. If your dog is found running at large it will be seized and impounded or if the owner is known, a fine of \$120.00 may be issued.

Pound fees will be enforced and they are as follows:

- (1) \$75.00 for a dog seized and impounded for the first time;
- (2) \$150.00 for a dog seized and impounded for the second time;
- (3) \$200.00 for a dog seized and impounded for the third time; and

The owner pays a maintenance fee of \$10.00 for each day, including the day of seizure, that the dog remains impounded.

Section 6.6 of By-Law No. 29.98 also states that no owner shall suffer, allow or permit his/her dog to defecate on private or public property without immediate removal.

Your co-operation with the above issues is appreciated.

A REMINDER FROM THE OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT

The Operations Department would once again like to remind all parents in the area, that the piles of snow along the roadways are an extremely dangerous place for their children to be walking on, playing on and digging tunnels. Please advise your children to stay away from the piles.
