By-Law to Regulate the Use of Temporary Shelters



NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Corporation of the Municipality of Red Lake will consider passing a By-Law to **Regulate the Use of Temporary Shelters** in the Municipality of Red Lake at the October 20th, 2009, Open Meeting of Council, to be held at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers, Municipal Office, Balmertown, Ontario.

Proposed conditions in the by-law are:

- No person shall erect a temporary shelter between May 1st – September 30th of the same year
- Temporary shelters must comply with the zoning by-law
- Temporary Shelter Permits must be approved - \$25.00 fee

A copy of the draft by-law is available for inspection in the Municipal Office between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday and is also available on the municipal website @ www.red-lake.com.

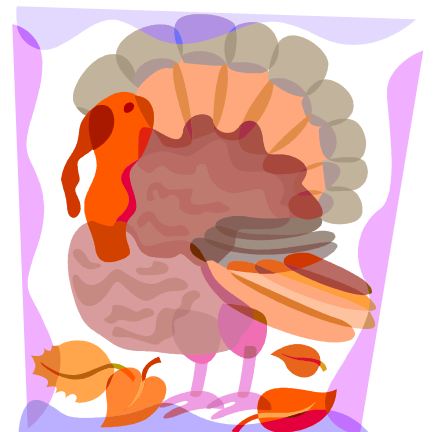

This year's Fire Prevention Week theme "Stay Fire Smart – Don't Get Burned" will focus on burn awareness and prevention, as well as keeping homes safe from leading causes of home fires.

The majority of fires happen in the home, and in order to prevent them, residents are encouraged to participate in Fire Prevention Week.

Red Lake Fire Rescue Service is hosting its annual open houses during Fire Prevention Week. There will be many fire safety activities, including tours, demonstrations and live fire extinguisher training. The Municipality encourages the community to take part in this event.

Make sure all smoke alarms are in working order!

It's a fact — having a smoke alarm in the house cuts your risk of dying in a fire *in half*. Almost 60% of all fatal residential fires occur in homes that don't have smoke alarms, so this may be the single most important thing you can do to keep your family safe from fires.

If your home doesn't have smoke alarms, now is the time to install them on every level of your home and in each bedroom. If possible, choose one with a 10-year lithium battery. If your smoke alarm uses regular batteries, remember to replace them every year (hint: change your batteries when you change your clock back from Daylight Saving Time in the fall). Test your smoke alarms monthly, and be sure your kids are familiar with the sound of the alarm.
