NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC



NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of Red Lake **defeated By-Law No. 1238-09 to Regulate the Use of Temporary Shelters** at their Regular Meeting of Council held Tuesday, October 20th, 2009. Temporary shelters will continue to be regulated by the Zoning By-Law. Temporary shelters are regulated similarly to a permanent structure used for accessory uses.

The draft Zoning By-Law provides for one (1) temporary shelter per lot; maximum size shall be 25.0 sq. m. (269.1 sq. ft); year round use is permitted. The draft Zoning By-Law is available for inspection on our municipal website @ www.red-lake.com.

WATER CONSERVATION TIPS



The Three R's

Reduce: Reducing your water use is as simple as turning off your tap while brushing your teeth, and operating dishwashers/washing machines with full loads.

Repair: Fix leaks as soon as you find them. Leaky taps and toilets can cost you money.

Retrofit: Install faucet aerators, replace an old showerhead with a low-flow model, or replace an old toilet with an ultra-low flush model. Water used in the bathroom can be reduced by up to 50%.

NOTICE OF DRAFT ZONING BY-LAW

Take Notice that the Municipality of Red Lake has been undertaking the task of updating the Municipality's Zoning By-Law and changes to the proposed By-Law presented at the public meeting on Tuesday, September 22nd, 2009, have been made. The latest version of the draft Zoning By-Law is available for viewing on the Municipality's website (www.red-lake.com) or at the Municipal Office during regular office hours.

Take Notice that if a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Municipality of Red Lake before the by-law is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the Council of the Municipality of Red Lake to the Ontario Municipal Board. If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting, or make written submissions to the Municipality of Red Lake before the by-law is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Municipal Board unless, in the opinion of the Board, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

Additional Information related to the proposed Zoning By-Law is available during regular office hours at the Municipal Office. A draft of the Zoning By-Law will also be posted on the Municipality's website (www.red-lake.com) and the consultant's website (www.tunnockconsulting.ca).


NOTICE OF PASSING OF BY-LAW NO. 1243-09**ZONING BY-LAW AMENDMENT PLANNING FILE NO. D14-09-06***The Planning Act s.34 (18)*

On October 20th, 2009, The Municipality of Red Lake Council accepted the recommendation of the Planning Advisory Committee to amend the Zoning By-Law as follows:

PURPOSE: The purpose of this Amendment is to rezone the subject lands from the Rural Residential Zone (R4) to Town site Residential (R1).

EFFECT: This Amendment will have the effect of allowing for the use of lands to change from Rural Residential (R4) uses and regulations to Townsite Residential (R1) uses and regulations.

LOCATION OF SUBJECT LAND: Lots 15, 16, 17 and 18 on Plan 23M-931; in the vicinity of the Kelson Farm town site, Municipality of Red Lake.



THE LAST DATE FOR FILING A NOTICE OF APPEAL is November 10th, 2009

Notices of appeal:

- i. must be filed with the Clerk of the Municipality or the Secretary-Treasurer of the Planning Advisory Committee,
- ii. must set out the reasons for the appeal, and
- iii. must be accompanied by the fee required by the Municipal Board.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a by-law to the Ontario Municipal Board. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.

No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of appeal unless, before the by-law is passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the council or, in the opinion of the Ontario Municipal Board, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

Additional information from the complete application and approved amendment is available for inspection at the Municipal Office.

OTHER PLANNING APPLICATIONS RELEVANT TO THE SUBJECT LOCATION: The subject location is also the subject of an application for subdivision to be considered.

A copy of the By-Law is available for inspection in the Municipal Office between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday. Written Submissions can be mailed to the attention of the Clerk or the Secretary-Treasurer of the Planning Advisory Committee, Municipality of Red Lake, P.O. Box 1000, Balmertown, ON P0V 1C0.
