Ontario Municipal Board Hearing regarding Goldcorp Kelson Farm Subdivision

The Ontario Municipal Board has issued a Memorandum of Oral Decision delivered by J.E. Sniezek and Order of the Board with regards to the Goldcorp Kelson Farm Subdivision. Five (5) Appellants submitted application(s) to the Ontario Municipal Board, with the applicable filing fee of \$125.00, to file appeals against the zoning By-Law and draft plan of Subdivision. Over two hearing days, the Board heard evidence from the Appellants who made presentations to the Board as participants in the hearing. The Ontario Municipal Board finds that the concerns of the Appellants are without foundation and the Appeals were all dismissed. The cost for the Municipality of Red Lake to be represented in defense of decision to approve the Kelson Farm Subdivision was approximately \$105,000.00. TEMPORARY SHELTERS



Please be advised that Temporary Shelters are regulated under the Municipality of Red Lake Zoning By-Law (No. 1277-10).

Temporary Shelters are considered to be accessory structures for the purposes of the Zoning By-Law and shall comply with the provisions of this By-Law regarding accessory structures. This includes all required setbacks (i.e. front, rear & side).

A maximum of one (1) Temporary Shelter shall be permitted per lot, and such temporary shelter shall not exceed 25m² (269.1 ft²) in gross floor area.

In addition to the above noted there may be further information you require pertaining to erecting a Temporary Shelter, so please contact the Municipal Office at 735-2096.

Residents and Businesses of the Municipality of Red Lake

At the request of the Municipality of Red Lake and Goldcorp, Union Gas is reviewing the feasibility of constructing a pipeline extension to bring natural gas from the Griffith Mine Site, north of Ear Falls, to Red Lake.

The Municipality of Red Lake remains one of the largest communities in Ontario that is not serviced by natural gas. As a result, energy costs for citizens and business represent a considerable financial burden. The availability of natural gas presents an opportunity to significantly reduce these costs.

There have been previous discussions and attempts regarding an extension of the pipeline to service Red Lake. In 1999, the Project did not proceed due to a shortfall in funding.

Along with Goldcorp, my Municipal staff and I have been in discussions with Union Gas to revive the Project. The Council of the Municipality of Red Lake endorses the Project. However, the Municipality does not have the financial capacity to contribute to the Project and is applying for Federal and Provincial funding for costs associated with the "Municipal" portion of the gas distribution system. Goldcorp also supports the Project and would make a significant financial contribution.

Strong residential and commercial support for the Project improves the business case for Union Gas and the potential for the Project to advance. As Mayor of the Municipality of Red Lake, I am writing this letter to encourage the citizens and businesses of Red Lake to participate in an upcoming Union Gas Survey to determine support for this Project and interest in converting appliances to natural gas. Over the September 7th-20th period, you may be contacted by Ipsos Reid on behalf of Union Gas. The survey will take approximately 5-7 minutes. During the same period, Union Gas also plans to carry out a door-to-door survey of commercial properties.
