HISTORY & FACTS OF THE KENORA DISTRICT SERVICES BOARD (KDSB)

Dan McNeill, Chief Administrative Officer for the KDSB, completed a presentation to Council at their Special Meeting held on February 13th, 2012. Listed below is a brief description of the presentation.

The KDSB was created by the Province of Ontario in 1999 to deliver social services on a **Regional** (Kenora District) versus **Local** (Community by Community) **basis**.

The KDSB Board of Directors consists of thirteen (13) members; one appointed member from each of the nine (9) municipalities (Kenora, Dryden, Sioux Lookout, Municipality of Red Lake, Ear Falls, Machin, Sioux Narrows-Nestor Falls, Ignace and Pickle Lake) and four (4) elected members from the Unincorporated Territories.

Geographically the area in which the KDSB serve is approximately 400,000 sq. km or approximately the size of the province of Newfoundland & Labrador. KDSB provides services to a population of approximately 60,000 people.

The following are the four (4) mandatory social services delivered by the KDSB:

- **Child Care**
- **Land Ambulance**
- **Ontario Works**
- **Social Housing**

The total municipal or local share of the 2012 Budget for the KDSB to offer the mandatory services is \$15,033,937. The distribution for all communities and unorganized is based on assessment, not population. The Municipality of Red Lake share of the 2012 KDSB budget is 5.6769%.

Total 2012 Levy for Municipality of Red Lake, which is paid on a monthly basis to the KDSB, is \$758,058 (see below):

NOTICE OF DECISION FOR ZONING BY-LAW AMENDMENT
PLANNING FILE NUMBER D14-11-06
Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13, s. 34.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of Red Lake passed By-Law No. 1585-12 at their Regular Meeting held Tuesday, February 21st, 2012, to approve a Zoning By-Law Amendment.

LOCATION OF PROPERTY: All land zoned or used for commercial purposes within the Municipality. Refer to a sketch of the Municipal Boundary to the right.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF BY-LAW: To change the definitions and general land use provisions of the Zoning By-Law to regulate outdoor patios associated with a commercial use; wording proposed as follows:

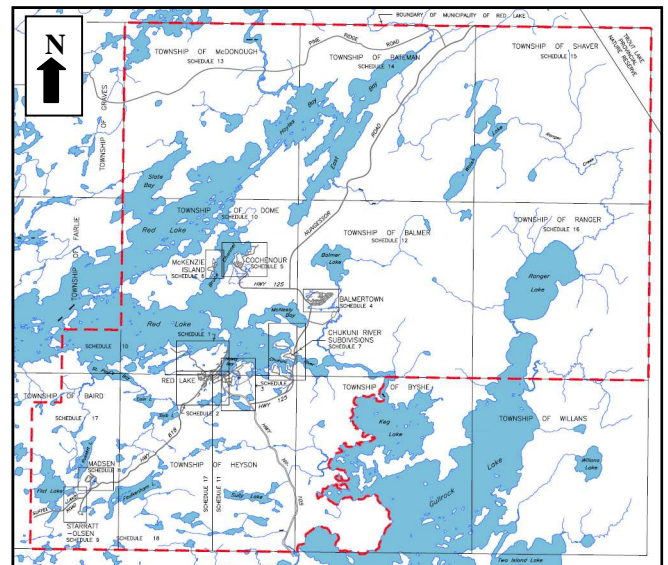
Section 2: Definitions

Outdoor Patio – Shall mean a commercially operated outdoor premise, area, deck or set aside platform on the ground floor; with or without a roof, a foundation, an attachment to a building, or direct access to the ground, for use by patrons as part of a restaurant or tavern, in connection with and in addition to, the operation of the indoor use that it is contiguous to, which area is designed and intended to be used seasonally as a sundeck.

Section 3.21.1: General Provisions

Outdoor Patios: Notwithstanding any other provisions of this By-Law, the following shall apply to an **outdoor patio** associated with a permitted commercial use including a **restaurant** or **tavern**.

- (a) **Capacity:** No outdoor patio shall accommodate more than fifty per cent (50%) of the licensed indoor capacity of the restaurant or tavern with which the patio is associated with.
- (b) **Location:** No outdoor patio shall be located in a yard abutting a residential or institutional zone. No part of an outdoor patio shall be located less than 10 metres (32.8 ft) from lands zoned for residential or institutional use. No outdoor patio shall be raised above the grade of the finished floor elevation of the ground floor.
- (c) **Yard Encroachment:** Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3.31, no outdoor patio associated with a commercial use shall be permitted to encroach into a required yard.
- (d) **Lighting:** All outdoor lighting shall be directed toward or onto the patio area and away from adjoining properties and streets.
- (e) **Parking:** Parking spaces shall be required for the total gross floor area associated with the outdoor patio at a ratio of 80% as for a restaurant or tavern.

Notices of appeal:

- i. must be filed with Shelly Kocis, Clerk of The Corporation of the Municipality of Red Lake
- ii. must set out the reasons for the appeal, and
- iii. must be accompanied by the fee required by the Ontario Municipal Board of \$125.00

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a by-law to the Ontario Municipal Board. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.

No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of appeal unless, before the by-law is passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the Council or, in the opinion of the Ontario Municipal Board, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

A copy of the By-Law is available for inspection in the Municipal Office between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday to Friday.
