Feeding Nuisance Animals

The Municipality would like to take this time to remind the public NOT to feed wildlife (ie: coyotes or other wild animals that have the potential to become a nuisance). This includes leaving any substances which could be reasonably expected to attract a wild animal or animals.



Proper garbage storage is also key to minimizing wildlife encounters and with bear season just around the corner, extra precautions are necessary to keep our families and properties safe.

Pet owners are also reminded to take extra precautions such as not leaving pets unsupervised especially during evening hours.

The set fine under By-Law No. 255-03 for the feeding of nuisance animals and/or the scattering of food on public or private property is \$100.00.

The set fine under By-Law No. 1376-10 for failing to keep grounds (yard) (vacant lots) (real estate) free of garbage and other refuse ie: improper storage of garbage is \$100.00.

The public is also reminded to contact the OPP (911) if a wild animal such as a coyote or other wild animals pose an immediate threat to personal safety such as exhibiting threatening or aggressive behaviour.

Distracted Driving



The OPP would like to take this time to remind motorists to keep their eyes on the road and electronic devices left alone while driving a motor vehicle.

The Highway Traffic Act was amended to include a section prohibiting driving a motor vehicle while using a hand-held electronic device however, to this day some drivers do not appear to 'get the message'.

Motorists are reminded that if you must use your cell phone in a hand-held manner, you must pull over, completely off the roadway and not in a live lane. Waiting at a red light or while stopped in a line-up of traffic is not considered 'off the roadway' and you risk being charged for the offence.

Remember that it is not just the law; it also can save your life or the life of another.

Curbside Collection



The Waste Management By-Law (No. 1376-10) states the following:

- 5.3 No person shall place any container, receptacle, garbage, rubbish, refuse or recyclable materials out for collection prior to the day of collection.
- 5.12 The designated pickup point shall be within 1 metre of the traveled road, lane or curb as may best facilitate collection.

BEAR ENCOUNTERS – WHO DO I CALL?

Black bears that come into a populated area aren't always a threat to public safety. Below please find who to contact about encounters with black bears.

Emergency Situations

Call 911 if a black bear poses an immediate threat to personal safety by exhibiting threatening or aggressive behavior, such as:

- Entering a school yard when school is in session.
- Stalking people and is lingering at the site.
- Entering or trying to enter a residence.
- Wandering into a public gathering.
- Killing livestock/pets and is lingering at the site.



Non-Emergency Encounters

Call the toll-free Bear Wise reporting line at 1-866-514-2327 (TTY 705-945-7641) if a black bear is:

- In a tree.
- Pulling down a bird feeder or knocking over a barbecue.
- Moving through a backyard or field but is not lingering.

This line operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week from April 1st until November 30th.
