**NOTICE OF DECISION
FOR THE UPDATE OF THE ZONING BY-LAW
BY-LAW NO. 1930-14**

Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.P.13, s. 34

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of Red Lake passed By-Law No. 1930-14 at their Regular Meeting held Monday, November 16th, 2015, thereby repealing Zoning By-Law No. 1277-10 and enacting a new Zoning By-Law for all lands in the Municipality.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF BY-LAW is to replace By-Law 1277-10 as the previous Zoning By-Law. The new By-Law provides for an improved implementation of the objectives and principles expressed in the Municipality's new Official Plan; clarification of terms and provisions; as well as removal of redundancies.

THAT under the authority of the *Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.13*, the Zoning By-Law provides that the council of a municipality may pass by-laws to prohibit and restrict the use of land; the erecting, locating or using of buildings structures; the use of land that is hazardous or subject to flooding; the use of contaminated land; the use of land within natural features, and the use of land based on the provision of municipal services;

THAT the council of a municipality may pass by-laws to regulate the type of construction and the height, bulk, location, size, floor area, spacing, character and use of buildings or structures; the minimum frontage, depth of a parcel of land and the proportion of the area thereof that any building or structure may occupy; the minimum elevation of doors, windows or other openings in buildings or structures; and to require the provision and maintenance of loading and parking facilities;

THAT the Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of Red Lake has deemed it to be in the public interest that such a by-law be enacted for the purpose of implementing the policies of the Official Plan of the Municipality of Red Lake; ensuring the orderly and controlled development of the Municipality; preventing development which would create an adverse effect on the Corporation; preventing development that may have a negative impact on the natural environment; and to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the Municipality of Red Lake;

THE LAST DATE FOR FILING A NOTICE OF APPEAL is Wednesday, December 9th, 2015.

Notices of appeal:

- i. must be filed with Christine Goulet, Clerk of The Corporation of the Municipality of Red Lake
- ii. must set out the reasons for the appeal, and
- iii. must be accompanied by the fee required by the Municipal Board of \$125.00

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a by-law to the Ontario Municipal Board. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.

No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of appeal unless, before the by-law is passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the council or, in the opinion of the Ontario Municipal Board, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

- All items must carry their original packaging.
- Home-canned or home-prepared food cannot be accepted.

Attention Dog Owners

2016 Dog Licenses are available starting December 1st, 2015!

This is a reminder that By-Law No. 1877-14 states no person residing within the limits of the Municipality shall own a dog without obtaining an annual license.

If you require a dog license the costs are as follows:

- For each spayed/neutered dog owned is \$15.00
- For each non-spayed/non-neutered dog owned is \$30.00
- For each additional dog owned in excess of two is \$100.00



Dog licenses are available at the Municipal Office, 2 Fifth Street, Balmertown.

Please be advised that failure to license may result in the set fine of \$50.00 per dog.

Due to increased traffic on Discovery Road, Red Lake, Council amended Parking By-Law No. 1046-08 for the safety of students and residents.



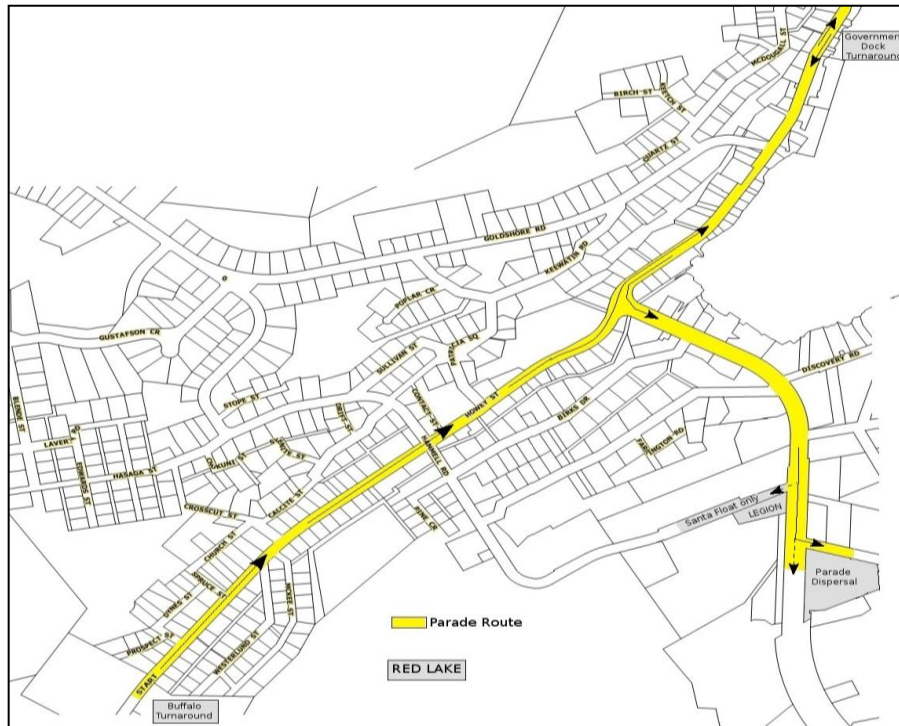
On the North side, from 49 Discovery Road to 55 Discovery Road, the following is in effect:

Floats can assemble at the Buffalo Turnaround between 6:00 p.m. and 6:20 p.m. The parade will proceed east along Howey Street to the Government Dock Turnaround. After looping, it will head back along Howey Street to the lights where it will turn left on to Highway 105 and continue to the Red Lake Royal Canadian Legion where the Santa Float will turn on to Hammell Road and park at the designated spot to allow Santa to disembark. The rest of the parade will continue to Young Street, where floats that remain can park or if they are returning to Balmertown or Cochenour, can continue along Highway 105.

Please Note: The South side of Howey Street from the CIBC parking lot entrance to the Government Dock is designated a “No Parking Zone” to ease congestion and allow space for people, particularly children, to watch the parade.
