Animal Bite Protocol

If you or your pet is bitten, a certain protocol must be followed:

- If victim's skin is broken, seek medical attention as soon as possible and take pictures of any injuries.
- If medical care is not available or obtained; contact **NWHU at 1-800-830-5978 as soon as possible**. NWHU will begin an investigation within 24 hours and will ensure the animal is confined for observation.
- Contact the By-Law Enforcement Officer at **807- 735- 2096** (you may be directed to contact OPP if the By-Law Enforcement Officer is unavailable).

Animal Owner Responsibilities

- Remove the animal from the situation (leash it; put in vehicle; separate into another room).
- Exchange personal information with victim such as phone numbers, home addresses and information regarding dog's latest vaccinations.
- Collect names and contact information from any witnesses present and document their knowledge of the incident.

****Do NOT destroy, sell or give away the animal until cleared to do so by someone in authority****

Animal Safety Tips

- Children are the most frequent animal bite victims. It is important to teach them about animal behaviour and respect for animals.
- Animals should not be disturbed while sleeping or eating.
- Animals need human interaction. Leaving an animal tied and consistently alone may cause aggressiveness.
- Always keep your face away from animals.
- If you are being chased while riding a bike, get off the bike and keep it between your body and the animal.
- Never break up an animal fight, even if it is your own pet.
- Do not approach stray animals. Instead, stay away and notify By-Law Enforcement Officer.
- Ask permission before petting an animal.
- If approached by an animal you don't know, stand tall and still.

No Parking – Snow Removal

By-Law No. 81-2016 states that effective November 1st until April 30th, there is to be no parking on any street within the Municipality of Red Lake (Cochenour Town Site is exempt) between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 7:00 a.m.

Any vehicle, which includes campers, trailers and boats, in violation of this By-Law will either be ticketed or towed at the owner's expense.

Transfer Site Attendant

\$24.51 per hour – 40 hours / week – Permanent Position

The Transfer Site Attendant will monitor the operation of the Transfer Site, operate the heavy equipment required to maintain the Transfer Site and transfer various types of waste out of district or province using AZ class equipment.
