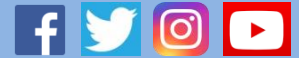

Snow Removal

Public Works crews have been working diligently to ensure roads and sidewalks are clear of snow.

Please help us by ensuring all snow remains on your own property. There have been situations throughout the Municipality where snow is being plowed across, or on to roadways and/or sidewalks. When this happens, roads can become narrow and sidewalks can become uneven. This makes for unsafe conditions.

Please help us in keeping our roads and sidewalks safe!

Predatory Animals

Red Lake is home to a variety of wildlife, including predatory animals such as wolves, coyotes and bears.

Help keep wildlife away from your property:

- DO NOT feed any wildlife – either intentionally or unintentionally. Making food available can attract wildlife to your property, can make them less fearful of humans, and make them accustomed to food provided by humans.
- Properly store garbage containers. Put garbage at curbside the morning of collection and not the night before.
- Use enclosed composting bins rather than exposed piles.
- Keep pet food indoors.
- Well lit yards may make your property less attractive to nocturnal wildlife.

Keep your pets safe:

- Feed pets indoors.
- Do not allow pets to roam off leash.
- Do not leave pets unattended outside unless they are in a kennel with a secure top.

What to do if you encounter a predatory animal:

- Never approach it or touch it.
- Do not turn your back or run. Back away from the animal while remaining calm.
- If the animal tries to approach you, stand tall, wave your hands and make lots of noise.
- Use a whistle, air horn or bear spray to scare the animal.
- Carry a flashlight at night.
- If there is an immediate threat or danger to public safety, call 911.

PROPERTY DESCRIPTION: The subject property is designated Townsite Residential, and zoned Rural Residential (R4).

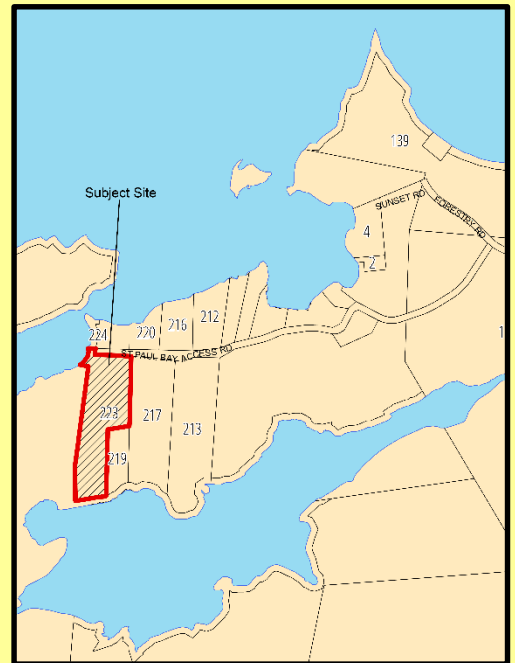
