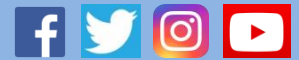

No Parking – Snow Removal

November 1st until April 30th

By-Law No. 81-2016 states that effective November 1st until April 30th, there is to be no parking on any street between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 7:00 a.m. within the Municipality of Red Lake (Cochenour Townsite is exempt from this By-Law).

This By-Law also prohibits the parking of campers, trailers, snowmachines, boats, etc. on any street and/or laneway within ALL townsites in the Municipality.

This By-Law is in place to allow for effective snow removal during the winter months.

Water Meter Notice

Winter is coming! This is a reminder to ensure your water meter does not freeze. Pursuant to By-Law 1030-08, the owner of a premises supplied with water agrees to provide adequate heat in the premises to prevent frost damage to the meter. So if your meter is located in an area that is not heated (ie) crawl space, please ensure your meter has a heat trace, is properly insulated or an aqua-flow (properly installed).

The By-Law further states that the owner of premises to be supplied with water agrees to provide convenient and safe space, free of charge or rent, for the Corporation's meter, pipes and other appliances on said premises, and further agrees that no one who is not a servant or agent of the Corporation or otherwise lawfully entitled to do so, shall be permitted to remove, inspect or tamper with any of the Corporation's said equipment.

If a meter is mechanically defective, the cost of repairs shall be paid by the Corporation, but if the meter is damaged by the carelessness or neglect of any person other than an employee or agent of the Corporation, the owner of the premises shall pay to the Corporation the cost of making the necessary repair to such meter.

SCAMMERS TARGET RED LAKE

(RED LAKE, ON) – Over the past several weeks, officers from the Red Lake detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) have received numerous calls from local residents regarding calls they have received at home and on their mobile devices from scammers holding themselves out to be local law enforcement or Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). They have stated they will transfer the target to an officer from Red Lake OPP, whom they identify as Officer Marshall. Do not release any information – they are attempting to extort money or gain personal information for identity theft.

CRA may contact you by phone at times, but they will never ask for information on your passport, health card or driver's license. They will never text you – any text message from the CRA is a scam. They will never demand immediate payment nor will they request payment via Interac e-transfers, online currency such as bitcoin, prepaid credit cards or gift cards from iTunes, Home Depot or any other retailers. CRA will never use aggressive language or threaten to send the police to arrest you. Hang up immediately if there's anything suspicious or unprofessional about the call. Single Use Wipes Clog Sanitary Sewer Systems

Do not flush **ANY** single-use wipes into the sewer system.

Single-use wipes (including those wipes labelled as “flushable”) are not safe to flush as they are buoyant; are not biodegradable; and they are not able to break down into small pieces quickly.

Single-use wipes accumulate in the sewer system and eventually clog the sanitary sewer system, which unnecessarily results in costs for the Municipality for additional repairs and maintenance on the municipal sewer system.
