Road Rehabilitation Project

It sure was a busy and productive summer for our Public Works Department! Thanks to funding secured from both the federal and provincial governments we were successful in completing a major road project consisting of rehabilitation of 4,361m of roadway and 492m of sidewalks in addition to construction of 2,238m of new sidewalks and over 1,812m of new curbing. This project also included all the necessary new underground infrastructure (storm drains and associated catchments) as well as landscaping.



In addition to these major road projects, we were able to complete paving in Madsen and McManus Subdivision!

Curbside Collection Reminders

Did you know?

- All garbage and recycling containers must not be more than one (1) meter from the traveled road or curb to ensure pick up.
- Bag tags are required on curbside garbage.
- Sealed containers are preferred, but if you do not have a sealed container, you must ensure your garbage bags are covered to prevent animals from getting into the bags.
- Bags must not be more than 15 kg to ensure pick up.
